April Meeting Focus



The April TVQG meeting speaker will be Art Quilter Deborah Sorem whose topic is "Making Art through Quilting" She will be sharing examples of her quilts to critique using the elements of design and principles of art.

Deborah’s Story

Deborah Sorem came from an artistic family who valued education. She was encouraged to pursue science in the 1960’s and 70’s. It was not until retiring to Oregon that Sorem studied the principles of art and design from fiber artists such as Lisa Call, Katie Paquini Masopust, Elizabeth Barton, Joen Wolfrom, Janet Fogg and Jean Wells.



Sorem lived most of her life in Minnesota. She retired to Salem, Oregon in 2007 where she became an active fiber artist as a member of SAQA and Columbia Fiber Arts. She regularly participates in juried shows and has exhibited in galleries in Salem, Cannon Beach, Eugene, Bend,

Oregon City, Washington D. C. and Tacoma.

Deborah enjoys making both wall and wearable fiber art. Her inspiration often comes from her photography. She uses a wide variety of techniques and combines her hand dyed fabrics and silks with commercial fabric. She has recently begun to focus on working in a series. Tips and Tricks

How to Get the Best Results with a Rotary Cutter

- ✂ When cutting with a rotary cutter you should always stand. You will have more control along with a straight perspective on your work.
- ✂ To keep the ruler from slipping while you cut, put a few small pieces of masking tape on the underside of your ruler.
- ✂ When the ruler is in position hold it with your fingers flexed. If your palm is flat on the ruler, it can easily slide out of position.
- ✂ Make sure the blade in your rotary cutter is sharp. The telltale signs that blade is getting dull include skipping or leaving small sections of fabric uncut. When you find yourself constantly going back over your cutting lines, it definitely is time for a blade change.
- ✂ Always cut away from you. This is not only a safety precaution, but you will also have more control cutting in that direction.

- * When sewing strip sets, if you change sewing directions with each strip it will help avoid the warpage that can occur when sewing several long strips together.
- * After you have fused applique' film to fabric and cut the shapes let the pieces cool for a while before removing the paper backing.
- * A magnetic pin holder keeps your pins handy in one place and if you should happen to drop pins on the floor the magnet is a handy way to pick them up.
- * For hand basting and quilting thread several needles at once (try four to six needles) and keep them in reserve. Then as you are working you won't have to constantly have to stop to rethread your needle.
- * When choosing your quilt backing fabric, think about whether you want the quilting stitch to stand out or not. If the fabric is a contrast to your thread color the stitches will be more predominant. If you use an active or busy print fabric, you stitches will be hidden.
- * When measuring the sides of your quilt for border strips, measure each side individually since they may differ slightly.
- * Thought you knew how to use a seam ripper? So did I until I discovered this article: [How to Use a Seam Ripper - Oh So Cool!](#) Check it out. This article provides photos and a video.
- * Try to have at least one dark and one light fabric in your quilt for contrast and interest.
- * Think about creating the border first then blend fabric to match the border colors.
- * Sometimes those bargain fabrics aren't really a bargain.
- * I always buy an extra ½ yard of fabric....mistakes happen.

There are NO set in seams or Y-seams - all the piecing is easy straight seams. This is great pattern for confident beginners, or those who have a mostly consistent (but not necessarily accurate!) quarter-inch seam. Quilting Board

Marie Godfrey wanted to share information on a site, [Quilting Board](#) she says she found interesting articles on topics including "*Learning color theory does not make it easier to choose fabric for a quilt*" and "*When we are studying color we tend to look at all the colors on the color wheel and get overwhelmed. And while color is important, the reality in quilt making is that value is really more important than color. You need value difference in your quilt -- value is light fabric, medium fabric and dark fabric. You need all three for the quilt to show contrast*". Note: you may need to register by creating a login name and password to access this sites information, but there is no cost to join.
