**August Speaker** 

**Janet Fogg** 



TVQG's speaker for August will be Janet Fogg. Here is a bit of information about Janet.

Skill and imagination are key words for describing Janet Fogg as an artist and pattern designer. They are what she strives to show when creating her original art quilts and what she hopes to share with other quilters with her collection of quilt patterns/kits for public use.

Mostly self-taught, Janet has been sewing since childhood when after losing her mother she claimed the family sewing machine as her own. "It became a tool for practically survival. both emotionally." Janet knew at a young age that she wanted to be an artist and pursued a graphic design degree and a career in art direction.

What she didn't know was that someday she would sew her art. "After leaving my design career to be a stay at home mom, I began to patch my two creative worlds together. All it took was one quilt and I was hooked." Many of the idea generation and design skills she practiced as an art director have surfaced in her approach to quilt making including visualization and brainstorming. "The idea or the beginning is the most important part of the work."

July, and we would like to thank each and every one of those ladies.




Antoinette Gratteri of our Membership Committee reports we have members that have renewed their membership for 2018-2019, leaving 25 prior year members yet to pay their dues.



\*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\*

COLOR 1 BLACK



Start by cutting the Color 1 2-1/2" x 30" strip into twelve 2-1/2" squares. Then cut the Color 1 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" squares. Stack those 2-7/8" squares and cut them in half once on the diagonal to make eight half square triangles...

COLOR 2 WhITE



Next cut the Color 2 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip into five 2-1/2" squares, then cut the Color 2 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" squares. Stack those 2-7/8" squares and cut them once on the diagonal to make eight half square triangles



Next, using a scant 1/4" seam sew the Color 1 and Color 2 half square triangles right sides together in pairs to make eight half square units. Trim these to measure 2-1/2" if needed...



Now lay out all the squares and half squares as shown at left. Sew five horizontal rows, alternating pressing direction by row. Join the rows to finish your Domino block! ...on to Page 2!
