Judy would like to us know we can

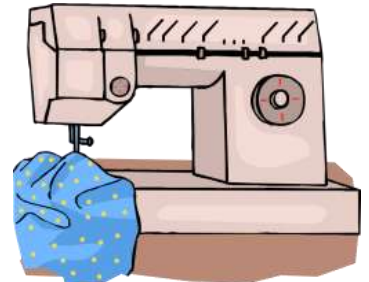
bring our completed sales items to either the September 18<sup>th</sup> or the October 16<sup>th</sup> General Meetings.

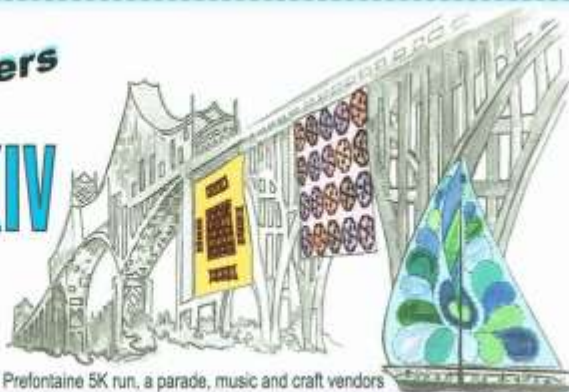

## *2018 Quilt Block Contest*

*Theme - Rhapsody in Blue*

### *Guidelines*

#### Colors

Any color of Blue, Solid or Print and  
White or White on White

#### Size

12 ½" x 12 ½"

To finish as a 12" x 12" block

- Use Pre-washed 100% cotton fabric
- Do not set blocks on point
- Block may be pieced and/or appliquéd but appliquéd must be trimmed on back
- Please, no fusing of fabrics  
– too difficult to hand quilt
- Entries limited to 2 blocks per person

## BOM Instructions

### Tualatin Valley Quilt Guild

September 2018 – Block of the Month

#### Fabric

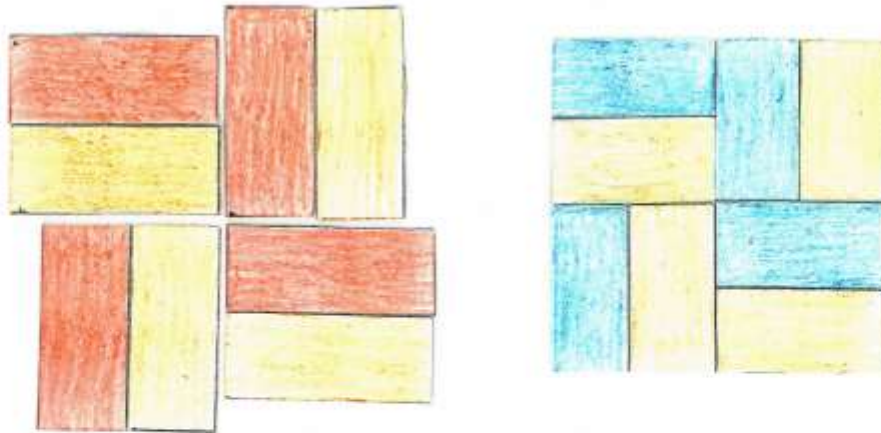
- 5 – 2 1/2" X 5" blue or red rectangle  
(only print or pattern fabric)
- 4 – 2 1/2" X 5" beige or cream rectangle  
(only print or pattern fabric)

With 1/4" seam sew each blue or red rectangle to the beige or cream rectangle.

Set the seams.



Beginning in the center, combine the two top pairs. Press. Then the lower pairs. Press.  
(There will be extra). Size the blocks to 8 1/2" square.



Pin the extra blue or red rectangle to the back of your block. The winner 😊 of the quilt can use them for a border!
