Bazaar Dates

How Are Bazaar Funds Used?

Just a reminder - this is the only fundraiser our guild holds.

Funds made from the Winter Bazaar helps our guild help to provide a fantastic array of speakers throughout the year. They offset our operating costs, are used to buy quilting supplies for our charity groups, and allow us to provide cash donations to other non-profit organization.

As you know, TVQG is a non-profit organization which means we support multiple charities both locally and nationwide. Our quilts go to homeless shelters, hospitals, seniors, children in foster care, and to families affected by disasters like fire and floods. We support our veterans through our Quilts of Valor efforts and donate checks to organizations like Days for Girls, Good Neighbor Center, and the Red Cross, just to name a few.

Volunteers

For the Winter Bazaar we need folks to help make it a successful event by helping to work the bazaar in 90 minutes shifts on Friday or Saturday. The Thursday evening before the Bazaar we need a setup crew for about an hour and the ladies working the last half hour on Saturday will need to help with breakdown and packing up of unsold items. Of course, your Bazaar Coordinators, Judy and Carol, will be there to assist throughout the setup, the sale, and the breakdown.

Sign-Up Sheet

We're passing around a sign-up sheet or it will be at the check in table for you to volunteer your time. It would be great if you could support us by working the sale. There are still open spots after last month's meeting. Please be sign up if you are willing. You can do your shopping before or after your shift.

What Can I Make

But in order to have a sale, what do we need? We need stuff to sell. And that's where we need to also rely on you. All handcrafted items are welcomed. Just make something you're comfortable creating and willing to share with us for the sale. Items don't have to be sewn or fabric-based - some of us like to make jewelry or other craft-type items as well as quilting -- just bring 'em in.

We've been asked for suggestions on what to make or what sells the best -- so let me answer that. Of course, quilts, because we are a quilt guild, aren't we? Any size quilt is great, but lap, twin, baby and children-sizes seem to be the best sellers.

Table runners, especially holiday or seasonal, place mats, napkins, mug rugs, coasters, fabric bowls, potholders, oven mitts, decorated towels, pillowcases, pin cushions, aprons, children's bibs, wall hangings, decorated bed or sofa pillows, shawls, totes or shopping bags. Other suggestions would be purses, zippered cosmetic or travel bags, shoe covers for packing shoes in a suitcase, storage cases, stuffed children or pet toys, Christmas ornaments, table covers----OK, by now I think you get the picture. Google "Easy to make craft fair items" and you'll get a whole list of suggestions.

Price Tags

One thing we'd like to ask; please help us out by pricing your own items. There's will be a supply of printed price tags at the check in table - help yourself to what you need. Price tags are included in the newsletter and printable from our website. We've found from past experience price tags stay in place better if you use a safety pin to attach them.

How To Get Items To Us

The October 15th General Meeting will be the last meeting to bring in your Bazaar Sales items, but you can bring them to us as late as the evening before the sale, Thursday, November 7th. Just drop them off while we're at the King City Clubhouse setting up the sales tables. Unsold Items

Any unsold items will be brought to the November meeting. Before the meeting starts at 7:00pm the maker of any unsold items will have an opportunity to take their creations home. Then during the break we'll sell any leftover items at a discounted price. Our goal is to not have any items to store from year to year.

Challenge Details

- Quilter picks a book
