I will try never to feel guilty About my stash or my UFOs: These are part of the quilting mystique As every quilter knows.






Above all, I will embrace The joys that quilting imparts Of friendship, fun and sharing That cheers and fills our hearts.

A Note from Sherry Little

Would you like a t-shirt (or other clothing items) with the Tualatin Valley Quilt Guild logo printed on it? The TVQG Board has been looking into what it would take to have t-shirts (or jackets, or travel mugs, or other items with our logo) available for purchase by our members. A company called Custom Ink can print our logo on a huge collection of clothing items, drinkware, tote bags, etc. (Most of these other items have a 'minimum order' number ranging from 12 to 60 items.) TVQG could make a "group order" of one specific item, such as a t-shirt or sweatshirt. The minimum number of items for a "group order" is six.

If at least 6 TVQG members want to purchase a shirt, we can proceed with setting up a group order from Custom Ink. We will start an account with them and determine the type, style, and size of shirts that will be on our selection list. You would need to go to their website and work through the selecting, ordering, payment, and shipping process. We will probably have the items all shipped to the same address. Then we would 'place the order.' There will a certain 'savings' to members of a group order, but it totally depends upon how many shirts are purchased. That means we won't know what the savings will be until we have a definite number of orders.

The Guild Board discussed the Custom Ink's fund-raiser options. It was decided that the Guild will not try to sell t-shirts to make money. The minimum number of required sales is too high a number and TVQG would be responsible for paying for all items that are not sold. Managing such a fund-raiser becomes quite complicated. Items like travel mugs would require minimum orders of 12-60 items and we may not have that many people who want a logo mug.

Custom Ink allows single orders. I made such an order. I chose a white, long-sleeve cotton t-shirt. I paid \$25 for it. It arrived in a couple of weeks, and I think it's a very nice shirt. I'll bring my new shirt to the Guild meeting on November 19th so you can see it.

TVQG/CARES Northwest Quilt Challenge Details

TVQG's Charity Quilter's group would like to present to our guild members a cooperative quilt challenge program between *King City Senior Village* and TVQG to create a book-themed child quilt to benefit the *CARES Northwest organization*.

Challenge Details

- Quilter picks a book
 - \circ \circ Find a book that you would like to gift to a child.
 - The book may be new or used, as long as it is in good condition.
- Quilter makes a quilt that depicts an element from the book.
 - Your quilt may be as simple or as complex as you choose just as long as it represents even the simplest details from the book, such as a color.
 - The quilt should child-sized (infant through juvenile), with a minimum size of approximately 36" x 40" and a maximum size of 45" x 60".
- Participants will have from May 21, 2019, to the February 18, 2020, General Meetings to complete their project.
- At the February 18, 2020 meeting quilters will be given the opportunity to present their quilt along with the book that inspired it.
- Our Charity Quilter's Team will then take your completed quilt and book set to the King City Senior Village, located at here in King City where it will be included in their onsite Quilt Show.
- Proposed date for King City Senior Village Quilt show has not been finalized but will be sometime in March or April of 2020.
 - We'll keep you updated with the show dates through our newsletter.
 - King City Senior Village will award 1st, 2nd, 3rd place ribbons to quilts presented in this category.
