The unfinished block size is 12-1/2" square, the finished block size is 12" square.

BOM Instructions.



1/8 YARD

- 4 White rectangles WHITE 3% x
- 4 green squares 3 %#
- 4 orange squares 3 1/2 "


Block Sewing Directions

Pin and sew two green and two orange 3 ½ "squares together to form a 4-patch as shown.

Make one 4-patch unit.

Pin and sew one white 3^{1} ,4 x 6^{1} /2" rectangle to each side of a-patch unit as shown to form block center. Press seams toward rectangles.

Pin and sew and green and one orange 3½ square to either side of one white 3¹K x rectangle as shown. Press seams toward rectangle. Make two combined
