MAY SPEAKER



Our May speaker is Cindy Calderwood who learned how to sew starting in Junior High and sewed her own clothes for many years. She grew up in a family of sewers, her grandmother, Ruth and Mother, Sherry taught her sewing techniques, as well. In fact, she still owns her Grandmother's Singer sewing machine and cabinet.

Cindy is a certified AnglePlay instructor who has been quilting for 14 years. She is a quilter who loves to use unique techniques and one of those techniques is using AnglePlay templates that were created by Margaret Miller. She took some of Margaret classes at the NW Quilting Expo and was hooked on the templates.

AnglePlay templates are a unique set of triangle templates that have the elongated tip lopped off so you can line up your triangles and get perfect points when you sew them together.

AnglePlay templates make quilting with elongated triangles fun and easy. Beginners will find them simple for making sharp points while more experienced quilters will love the versatility. No complicated math required as the seam allowances are built into the templates.

Cindy received her certification as

an AnglePlay instructor from Julie Luoma of Off the Wall Quilting, who purchased the business from Margaret Miller.

If you are interested in learning how to use the templates, she would be happy to set up a class.

Updates for May

CHARITY QUILTERS NAME CHANGE

The TVQG team heading our charity efforts is changing the name of their group to Comfort Quilts. It was felt that the name Comfort Quilts more effectively conveys this group's efforts.

Door Prizes

Each month two \$20 gift certificates are awarded to quilters attending the General Meeting. Everyone attending the meeting, guests included, will receive a ticket for the drawing.

COMFORT QUILTERS (Formally Charity Quilters)

Last Month Melanie Sagebear provided an update on the efforts of the Comfort Quilters. She shared with us that in the last 4 months alone the Comfort Quilters Team distributed \$750 in cash to local charities, distributed 135 quilts, 15 crocheted afghans, 15 blankets, 42 various toys, and books, and shipped 150 pounds to the Navajo Nation including a sewing machine, fabrics, and notions. Also donated to local charities were cleaning supplies and hygiene products and food items.

Also, Melanie responded to the needs of a local young lady, Andie, who has multiple medical issues. She reached out to the community via the Nextdoor app seeking correspondence. Melanie saw her request, responded to it, and befriended her. While speaking with Andie, Melanie found out her favorite color is purple. So instead of just friending her, Melanie went over and beyond by making Andie a purple quilt. Here are pictures of Andie with the quilt she gifted her.

Quilting Challenges

Throughout the year TVQG offers several quilting challenges. These challenges are intended to help increase member's quilting skills and may include making quilts to benefit local charities.

Sampler Quilt Block Exchange – Pizza Box series

This challenge started in October 2021 and concludes at the April, meeting. They will be shown at the June 21, 2022, meeting.

UFO Challenge

We will continue the UFO challenge from last year. Because of the disruption from COVID we will not be charging the usual \$5 to participate. For every finished UFO (or picture) that they share during the Show and Tell segment at any General Meeting between now and October 2019, they'll earn a drawing ticket. Date for next year TBD for the drawing.

FUNDRAISING

As with any organization, having the funds to operate at a productive level is absolutely necessary. TVQG is no exception. As of this writing, our guild's checkbook balance is down to \$1,063. Since resuming in-person meetings, we have been operating solely on 2021/2022 membership dues. Our last source of income other than yearly dues was the Winter Bazaar of 2019. Dues alone are not enough to support us. Our expenses during the last two years have included cash donations to local charities such as the Good Neighbor Center and Days for Girls. Since resuming in-person meetings, we faced rising speaker costs along with increased costs to support our Comfort Quilters, Quilts of Valor efforts, and free Sew Days. Please reach out to Michelle Faber if you have any questions regarding TVQG's income and expenses.

We all need to think about and help with money-raising activities. Some suggestions being considered include the raffle of two completed quilts, a bazaar, craft sale, or garage sale type of event, and the inclusion of a paper bag drawing or silent auction at each General Meeting.

But....and this is a big...your Guild needs to call on each of our members for ideas and suggestions for fundraising as well as to support our current actives and non-profit efforts. Please bring your ideas to the next meeting.

PAPER BAG DRAWING and SILENT AUTION

With the need to increase funds, starting at the May 2022 General Meeting we'll be holding a fund-raising paper bag drawing and/or a silent auction of items donated by your guild's board members. In the future, we would like to enlist your assistance to also donate new or unused quilting items such as charm packs, fat quarter sets, jelly rolls, or similar type items for future meeting fund-raising sales. Because this is a brand-new effort, additional details on this project will be included at our next general meeting.



When you make a quilt for donation you have a choice of where you would like to donate.



white FABRIC:

cut 3 41/2" squares

cut 1 47/8' square FOR HST

Orange FABric:

cut 1 41/2" square

Turquoise FABric:

CUT 3 41/2 Squares

cut 1 47/8' square FOR HST

FABRICS)

Fast and Easy Half-Square Triangle (HST) Ur

Cut squares of light fabric and squares of dark fabric, adding 7/8" to the desired finished block size, as shown in the given chart. Each pair of light and dark squares will make (2) HST units. (i.e., If you need (50) HST blocks, cut 25 light and 25 dark squares)


Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each light square.

Place a marked square, right sides together, on top of a dark square. Sew 1/4" away on both sides of the drawn line.



Cut on the drawn line. Open and press toward the dark fabric.
