Comfort Quilts Open Sew Days

TVQG King City Clubhouse Quilters Group

Did you know that TVQG host a monthly Open Sew Days at the King City Civic Association Clubhouse located in King City, OR?

All Quilters within our community are invited to join us in the Multipurpose Room of the King City Clubhouse between 10:00am and 3:00pm on the fourth Saturday of every month. You can drop by based on your schedule, stay all day, or just for an hour or two, the choice is yours. There is no charge to attend our Monthly Open Sew Day. To make things simple there is no sign-up sheet. Just show up with your sewing machine and projects to work on. Some quilters even forgo bringing their machine and simply

join their fellow quilters while doing handwork, such as binding a quilt. Irons, ironing boards, and cutting stations will be set up for your use. After all, this is your Monthly Open Sew Day!

TVQG's Open Sew Days are a great opportunity to interface with your fellow quilters. Lunch will be on your own, but we often join forces to bring in food for a group lunch.

Better yet, if interesting in making a Comfort Quilt, free fabric, batting, and patterns are stored on-site and are available during all Open Sew Days for you to select from.

Sherwood Charity Quilters Group

Hopewell House Quilt Donation

On Friday, May 20th the TVQG Comfort Quilters was contacted by the Friends of Hopewell House with a request for quilts. The following day, TVQG put out an all-member communication asking our members to assist with this effort, and by Tuesday, May 24th Melanie and Carol delivered these 20 Quilts to them.

The Hopewell House would like to express their thanks for these quilts and they are looking forward to receiving quilts from TVQG in the future.

Here is some information the Friends of Hopewell House shared with our Comfort Quilters:

"In the fall of 2019, Legacy, who owned Hopewell House was forced to close due to financial constraints. Friends of Hopewell House was then established and will reopen the facility in 2022 as the region's only residential hospice facility. The home will be a 12-13 bed facility, each topped with a donated quilt, and will include a pediatric room (as sad as that is). It is estimated that Hopewell House will once again be able to serve approximately 150 individuals per year. Hopewell will be caring for those with the greatest need and the fewest options, with diversity in mind

The Quilt Program will offer patients a quilt of their choice, handmade by generous and creative community members who have donated their time, talents, and materials. Each quilt will remain with the patient during their care. Upon the patient's death, their quilt will be part of their "passage observance" with their family, friends, and caregivers. The family will be invited to take the quilt home with them. As you can see, the quilt takes on an extremely meaningful, moving, and cherished gift."

New Charity Quilt Donation Form

Because TVQG's Charity Quilters Team wants to make sure the quilt you are donating to our guild's charity efforts is forwarded on to a charity of your choosing, a form is being used for you to attach to any quilt being donated. Using this form, we will try our best to ensure that each and every donated quilt is received by the charity of your choice. Forms are published with each monthly newsletter (at the end), available on our website, or at the check-in desk at monthly meetings.

Fabric Donations

Let us know if you have any fabric, or batting (larger-sized scrap pieces are OK) to donate towards our charity efforts. We'll be glad to arrange for a drop-off or a pick-up. We especially need larger-sized backing fabrics.

Just a quick reminder at every monthly meeting we have a box available for items to donate to the Good Neighbor Center. And as a bonus for your efforts, you'll receive an extra ticket door prize ticket.

Quilting Challenges

Throughout the year TVQG offers several quilting challenges. These challenges are intended to help increase member's quilting skills and may include making quilts to benefit local charities.

Sampler Quilt Block Exchange – Pizza Box series

This challenge started in October 2021 and concluded at the May meeting where everyone received their own pizza box. They will be shown at the July 19, 2022, meeting where they will be eligible to win a drawing.

UFO Challenge

We will continue the UFO challenge from last year. Because of the disruption from COVID we will not be charging the usual \$5 to participate. For every finished UFO (or picture) that they share during the Show and Tell segment at any General Meeting between now and October 2019, they'll earn a drawing ticket. Date for next year TBD for the drawing.

FUNDRAISING

As with any organization, having the funds to operate at a productive level is absolutely necessary. TVQG is no exception. As of this writing, our guild's checkbook balance is down to \$1,063. Since resuming in-person meetings, we have been operating solely on 2021/2022 membership dues. Our last source of income other than yearly dues was the Winter Bazaar of 2019. Dues alone are not enough to support us. Our expenses during the last two years have included cash donations to local charities such as the Good Neighbor Center and Days for Girls. Since resuming in-person meetings, we faced rising speaker costs along with increased costs to support our Comfort Quilters, Quilts of Valor efforts, and free Sew Days

We all need to think about and help with moneyraising activities. Some suggestions being considered include the raffle of two completed quilts, a bazaar, craft sale, or garage sale type of event, and the inclusion of a paper bag drawing or silent auction at each General Meeting.

But....and this is a big...your Guild needs to call on each of our members for ideas and suggestions for fundraising as well as to support our current actives and non-profit efforts. Please bring your ideas to the next meeting.

PAPER BAG DRAWING and SILENT AUTION

With the need to increase funds, starting at the June 2022 General Meeting we'll be holding a fund-raising paper bag drawing and/or a silent auction of items donated by your guild's board members. In the future, we would like to enlist your assistance to also donate new or unused quilting items such as charm packs, fat quarter sets, jelly rolls, or similar type items for future meeting fund-raising sales. Because this is a brandnew effort, additional details on this project will be included at our next general meeting.

A BRAND-NEW QUILTING CHALLENGE

We are still in the development stage of presenting a new quilting challenge to our quilters. As soon as all the details of the next challenge are coordinated you will be the first to know. Stay Tuned.

HOW TO MAKE THE BLOCK

Five Patch Shoo Fly

Finished Block 10"

Cut:

(1) Grey 2 1/1" square

(2) Grey 4 7/8" squares


(2) Pink 4 7/8" squares

(4) Pink 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

For TVQG BOM Fabric/Color Profile

Change Grey to White Fabric Change Pink to any color 30's fabric

- -On the wrong side of a Grey 4.7/8" square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner.
- -Place a Grey and a Pink square right sides together and sew %" on both sides of the line.
- -Cut apart along the drawn line. Press seams to one side to form HST. Square to 4 ½". Repeat with remaining 4 7/8" squares.
- -Lay out the HSTs, the Grey 2 %" square and the Pink 2 %" x 4 %" rectangles as shown, rotating as needed. Sew together into rows and then sew rows together.
