Hi, my name is Robin O'Neil. I was a special education teacher for 35 years and began making quilts the same year I entered the classroom. My interest in both was sparked by children who seemed fearless about color, pattern, and play.

My quilt making journey began with traditional quilts striving for tidy points, perfect corners, even seams and sensible color combinations.

After about 100 quilts, I left that behind. My new philosophy is to HAVE FUN, preferring improvisation piecing. I use no templates, no patterns, no basting, no rulers and no worries. Scraps are my friends. When something I am making doesn't work, I usually turn it upside down or cut it into pieces and reassemble. I add borders or sashing or an unexpected slice of color.

My thought is: life is too short for stress and fretting, especially about quilts!

BLOCK OF THE MONTH INSTRUCTIONS

BOW TIE QUILT BLOCK UNFINSHED SIZE 12 1/2 INCHES

Using a white background and all shades of blue. A fun easy block this is one of my favorite blocks to make.


Fabric Requirements:

White background fabric: (A) 2 squares 6 1/2"

Solid or print Blue fabric bow tie fabric: (B) 2 squares 6 ½"; (C) 2 squares 3" same fabric

That's it! Bow Tie Blocks are so fun and easy to make.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of both (C) 3 "fabric squares. With right sides together, place a (C) square on the corner of one (A) 6 ½" square. Stitch on the drawn line and trim seam to ½"; iron flat pressing seam to the darker fabric. This partial Bow Tie unit should measure 6 ½ x 6 ½". Repeat these steps again, making two matching blocks from the (A)/(C) squares.

TVQG 2023Charity Quilt Challenge

TVQG/CARES Northwest Quilt Challenge Details

TVQG would like to present our 2023 Quilt Challenge to our guild members. This challenge consists of creating a book-themed child's quilt to benefit the CARES Northwest organization.

Challenge Details

- Quilter picks a book
 - 1. Find a book that you would like to gift to a child.
 - The book may be new or used, as long as it is in good condition.
- Quilter makes a guilt that depicts some element from the book.
 - Your quilt may be as simple or as complex as you choose just as long as it represents even the simplest details from the book, such as a color.
 - Your quilt should be child-sized (infant through juvenile), with a minimum size of approximately 36" x 40" and a maximum size of 45" x 60".
- Participants will have from January 17, 2023, until the May 16, 2023, General Meetings to complete their project.
- At the May 16th General Meeting quilters will be given the opportunity to present their quilt
 along with the book that inspired it.
- Donated quilts will then be forwarded to CARES Northwest
- We are hoping to have a Cares Northwest representative at the May General Meeting who will
 give our members an overview of their organization and receive our completed quilts.

The CARES Northwest organization is one of the various charities TVQG quilters support. CARES Northwest helps abused or neglected children by providing them with a quilt. Their mission is to stop child abuse and neglect through multidisciplinary prevention, medical evaluation, and ongoing treatment in partnership with the community. When we held this challenge in 2020 we presented 53 quilts to them. Wouldn't be wonderful if we could beat our record? Here are a couple of pictures from our 2020 event.
