Janet Fogg will be our speaker.

Skill and imagination are keywords for describing her as an artist and pattern designer. She strives to show her skills and imagination when creating her original art quilts and she hopes to share these skills with other quilters

with her collection of quilt patterns and kits.

Mostly self-taught, Janet has been sewing since childhood. After losing her mother she claimed the family sewing machine as her own. “It became a tool for survival, both practically and emotionally.” Janet knew at a young age that she wanted to be an artist and pursued a graphic design degree and a career in art direction.

What she didn’t know was that someday she would sew her art. “After leaving my design career to be a stay-at-home mom, I began to patch my two creative worlds together. All it took was one quilt and I was hooked.” Many of the idea generation and design skills she practiced as an art director have surfaced in her approach to quilt making including visualization and brainstorming. “The idea or the beginning is the most important part of the work.

## CARES NORTHWEST QUILT CHALLENGE

Members are invited to participate in a quilt challenge for CARES Northwest that starts this month and will conclude at the May general meeting. This will be the focus of the May meeting.

CARES Northwest is a collaborative, community-based medical program for the assessment, treatment and prevention of child abuse. We provide a safe, child-friendly environment for the assessment of children for whom there are concerns of physical or sexual abuse, neglect and exposure to domestic violence. Physical examinations and interviews are conducted in a comfortable environment to help children feel safe.

The challenge is to purchase a children's book and create a quilt based on the book – be it a character or theme. The quilt and the book will then be given to a representative.

They accept blankets made with **NEW**, **CLEAN**, and **WASHABLE** materials in infant, child, or teen friendly colors.

Approximate sizes:

- ✓ Baby blankets: 30" x 36" (minimum size)

- ✓ Children's blankets: 42" x 60
- ✓ Teen's blankets: 45" x 72" (maximum size)

Suggest materials: 100% cotton fabric, flannel or polar fleece.

Throughout the year TVQG offers several quilting challenges. These challenges are intended to help increase member's quilting skills and may include making quilts to benefit local charities

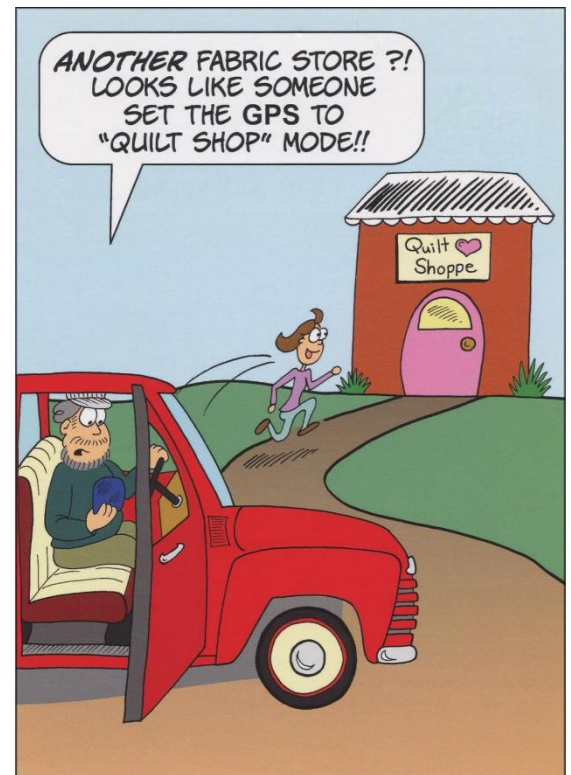



## November Block of the Month

Scrappy 13 ½ inch block by Darlene Michaud  
Utube Tutorial

Colors for the November Blocks:

Blues

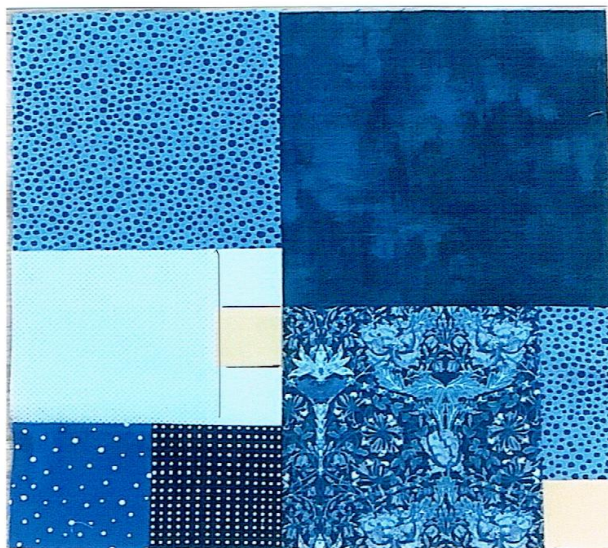
Some white

A touch of yellow

This block goes together quickly, I have found it useful particularly for Charity Quilts. My blocks have all come out to 14 inches. Darlene trimmed hers to 13 ½ inches. As always, the ½ in. is for sewing allowance. The photo will show placement of patches, to complete the block.

Cutting instructions:

- 1 8 in. square
- 2 6 ½ in. squares
- 1 5 in. square
- 2 3 ½ in. squares
- 4 2 in. squares
- 1 2 X 5 in. rectangle
