The color profile for the **Window Pane Block** is black-on-white, and white-on-black prints combined with bright blue or green fabric.

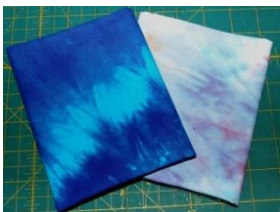


The color profile for the **Shoofly Variation Block** consists of three contrasting pastels.

May 16, 2023, marked the conclusion of the Tualatin Valley Quilt Guild's latest charity quilt challenge. Our quilters rose to new heights by bringing to the May General Meeting a record-breaking 59 quilts and book sets to be donated to [CARES NW](#) organization. This year-long

challenge consisted of TVQG members picking a book and then making a quilt based on an aspect of the book. Our charity coordinator, Shirley Shultz processed

this huge donation through the Linus organization. Then on May 25th our quilts were delivered to CARES NW.

The mission of the CARES NW organization is to stop child abuse and neglect through multidisciplinary prevention, medical evaluation, and ongoing treatment in partnership with our community. Children ranging in age from infants through teens may receive one of our quilts as part of their program.

A big thank you goes out to every one of our quilters who participated in this challenge. You brought a little bit of love and caring to a child through your generosity.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH INSTRUCTIONS

Shoofly Variation Block



Fabric: use contrasting pastels.

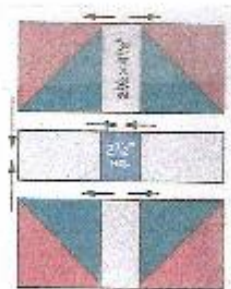
Fabric A: cut 2 squares, $4\frac{1}{8}$ ".

Fabric B: cut 2 squares, $4\frac{7}{8}$ ", and one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Fabric C: cut 4 rectangles, $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{8}$ "

1. Use a pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of each "A" square.
2. Layer an "A" square on a "B" square; sew together with two seams, stitching $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of pencil line. Cut apart on pencil line. Press open to make two triangle squares. Each triangle square should be $4\frac{1}{8}$ " including seam allowances.
3. Sew rows together as per diagram, and join rows to make the block.

Unfinished block should be $10\frac{1}{8}$ " square including seam allowances.



Window Pane Block 10" Finished.

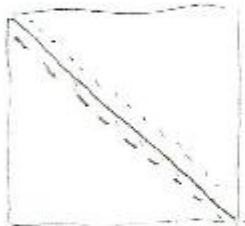
cut 2: 5" sqs Black on white for HST's

cut 2: 5" sqs white on Black " "

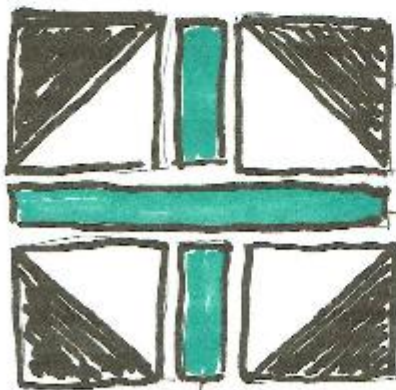
cut 2: 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles Bright Blues
" greens

cut 1: 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle. Bright Blues
" greens.

make 4 HST: pair the Black/white 5" sq.



draw a diagonal line on the white fabric. Sew 1/4" on each side of drawn line. Cut on drawn line. Press to dark. Trim to 4 1/2" sq, to equal 4 HST.



Sew As shown @ left.

4 1/2" HST
Black on outside

2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rect.

2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rect.

HST = half square triangle.
