JULY BLOCK OF THE MONTH



The Block of the Month for August is the Oh Suzanna Block. Quilters are invited to make this block to bring to the August 16, 2023, General Meeting.

The color profile of this block is solid white for the corners, solid white and solid blue for the half-square triangles, combined with solid blue and blue and yellows prints. The unfinished size of this block is 12-1/2" and the finished size when placed in a quilt will be 12".

Hint: You may want to cut the HST's a bit oversized (I cut them to 4" instead of 3-7/8") then trimmed to 3-1/2".

The pattern is on page 7.

For every block of the month presented you will receive a ticket. If you are the lucky winner you will be awarded all the blocks submitted for the month.

FAT QUARTER OF THE MONTH



The TVQG August 2023 Fat Quarter Drawing is beach themes. Any fabric pattern that represents a scene or something that could be found on a beach, at the seashore, or in the water would fall within the Beach-theme category.

For each themed fat quarter you bring to the TVQG August 16th General Meeting you'll receive a ticket for the Fat Quarter Drawing.

Here's a list of the Fat Quart themes for 2024:
September – fall colors: orange, yellow, red, brown, leaves

October – pumpkins, ghosts, witches

November – red, green, trees, football, basketball

January – snowflakes, light blue, white

February – hearts, love, candy hearts, red, pink, white, Valentines

March – tulips, daffodils, spring colors

April – clouds, rain, showers

May – spring flower prints and colors, pinks, yellow, pale orange, pale violets, creamy white

June – sunshine, baseball

Each year we display up to 200 quilts of all sizes in an art gallery-like setting on the third floor of the historic Thomas Kay Woolen Mill Building. Our show also includes a quilt challenge sponsored by The Grand Hotel and Good Vibes Quilt Company and is shown in the lobby at The Grand. We also have a number of vendors as well as a pre-show Saturday breakfast with this year's special guest artist, Erica Jackman of Kitchen Table Quilting. We also have demonstrations and talks during the show along with our Re-Stash Boutique which we say is like the best quilt shop you've ever seen with yard sale prices!

Quiltopia- Quilt Show at the Mill is much more than just another quilt show. Every dollar raised at the show goes to Helping Hands Resources of Salem to support those in need. Helping Hands Resources is located just south of downtown Salem. Last year over 4000 families visited

nearly 19,000 times to receive essentials such as clothing, bedding, household items, books, and toys.

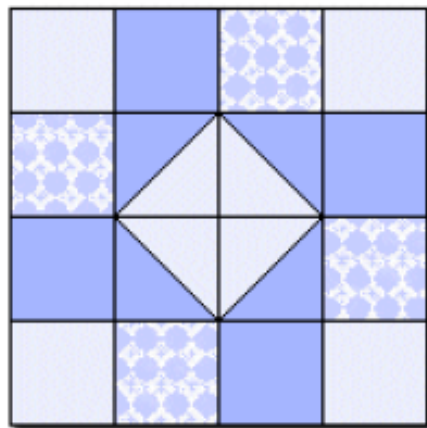

This makes a 12" block.

**Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block



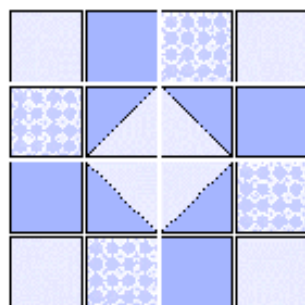
To make the needed 3-1/2" squares you will need a 14" x 3-1/2" strip of each color. Stack these together, and then using a rotary cutter, cut into four 3-1/2" squares of each



Next, cut two 3-7/8" squares of Colors 1 and 3, stack these.



Using a rotary cutter, cut them on the diagonal, being careful not to stretch fabrics. With right sides together, sew Color 1 and Color 3 triangles together, using a 1/4" seam. Press seam allowances towards darker fabric...



Now piece the squares as shown at the left, sewing four horizontal rows using 1/4" seams. Join the resulting rows and there you have it!
