SEPTEMBER – HELENE KNOTT



TVQG Members and Guests are honored to have the well-known quilt artist, Helene Knott speak at the September 19, 2023 meeting.

Here is some background information on her – Helene was born and raised on the Monterey Peninsula in central California, a beautiful area that

served as an inspiration to set her onto a creative path for life. From a very early age she showed a keen interest in art, starting with drawing and painting and exploring different mediums for her self-expression. Blessed with proficient drawing and illustration skills, Helene has explored a number of artistic mediums. In the early 70's, she turned her attention to fiber and fabrics, with a focus on quilting and embroidery.

Quilting was experiencing a renaissance in popularity and making a gradual transition from utilitarian craft to an art form. Helene found herself intrigued by the medium; its challenges and possibilities. For the last 40 years or so, fiber and quilting has been her primary medium. Helene has a love for exhibiting her work, and has expanded her interest to include teaching her skills and knowledge to others, to inspire a new generation of quilters and fiber artists.



The color profile for this block is assorted yellow prints, a brown solid or print combined with a low profile print or solid in cream for the background. The unfinished size of this block is 12-1/2" and the finished size when placed in a quilt will be 12".

The pattern is on pages 9-12.

For every block of the month presented you will receive a ticket. If you are the lucky winner you will be awarded all the blocks submitted for the month.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH INSTRUCTIONS

Sunflower Power by Vanessa Goertzen of Lella Boutique

2017 Aurifil Designer of the Month Block

Finished Block: 12" x 12"



Sunflower Power*

Finished block: 12" x 12"

MATERIALS NEEDED

24 squares 2" x 2"	assorted yellow prints
12 squares 2 %" x 2 %"	assorted yellow prints
12 squares 21/2" x 21/2"	background fabric
4 squares 2" x 2"	background fabric
I square 61/2" x 61/2"	sunflower center print

Fabric is Olive's Flower Market/Sugar Pie/Farmer's Daughter by Lella Boutique for Moda Fabrics.

"This block is similar--but not identical--to the one found in my pattern #164 Scrappy Sunflowers (i.e. You will not be able to make my Scrappy Sunflower quilt with this block.)








*Assume 1/4" seam allowance *RST means right sides together *Press toward the dark print


HALF-SQUARES TRIANGLES (HSTs): Mark a diagonal line on the back of 1 background square 2 1/2" x 2 1/2". Bring 1 marked square RST with 1 yellow square 2 1/2" x 2 1/2". Sew 1/4" away from the marked line on both sides. Cut along the marked line, open, press, and trim each HST to 2" x 2". Make 24 yellow/white HSTs.




 <u>SNOWBALL BLOCKS</u>: Mark a diagonal line on the back of 4 yellow squares 2" x 2". Bring each marked yellow square RST with 1 sunflower center 6 1/2" x 6 1/2", in each corner. Align the raw edges and orient the marked lines as shown. Sew along the marked line, trim 1/4" seam allowance, press.



 Arrange all 2" squares/HSTs into the arrangement as shown below. Sew all squares into rows and press--the center section will contain 4 partial rows on the sides of the center 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" snowball center block. Sew the partial rows into columns and press.



 Sew the center columns to the sides of the 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" snowball center block and press. Sew all rows together; press. Unfinished block measures 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".
