MARCH SPEAKER



Nancy Goldsworthy of ninepatchquilting.com will be the featured speaker at TVQG's March 19, 2024, General Meeting. Here is

some information about Nancy:

Sewing has been my passion since I was very young. My love for fabric has driven my career from my first job in a shirt factory to my current longarm quilting business. Along my journey, I have learned the ins and outs of both the garment and fabric industries. From working with the fabric vendors to sending the finished product out the door, I have done it all.

But my favorite part is still sitting and sewing the pieces together. The repetition of picking up the pieces and stitching them one after another is very soothing, even after the roughest day. Quilting has been my focus for the past 20 years. I love the colors and patterns that are formed as you stitch. I can spend hours at my machine taking little pieces and stitching them into big pieces. And when that part is done, I get to quilt them!

I purchased my longarm machine in 1999 and everything changed. Now I could start a quilt and have it pieced, quilted, bound, and finished in days, rather than weeks! I also discovered that there was very little information available to help us learn how to operate these wonderful machines. Frustration with the big machines was a common topic of conversation amongst longarm quilters. Thread breakage, batting issues, and stitch quality were always the first issues on everyone's list, except mine. My many years in industrial sewing gave me an insight into how needles, threads, and fabrics worked and why. And a new career was born.

I discovered not only that quilters needed the information that I had gleaned in 30 years working with the industrial machines, but that I enjoyed teaching them. There is nothing better than watching the light come on over their heads when they "got it". I also discovered that I enjoy writing. I have had 4 books published on the technical parts of needles, threads, batting, and more. The original books are currently out of print but look for the new updated versions to be ready soon.

FEBRUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH



The Block of the Month for March 2024 is a Scrappy variation on a Log Cabin. Quilters are invited to make this block to bring to the March 19, 2024 General Meeting.

The color profile for this block uses white or white-onwhite as a background combined with the scrappy fabrics of the quilter's choice

The unfinished, block size is $10'' \times 10.5''$ and the finished block size is $9.5'' \times 10''$.

Also, quilters are being asked to create two secondary blocks from the trimmed corners which results in 5.5" unfinished-size blocks. Please include these secondary blocks when submitting the Scrappy Log Cabin block.

COFFEE CREEK QUILTERS

Quilting Classes Return to Coffee Creek Correctional Facility

At Coffee Creek Quilters we're thrilled to announce that we are again teaching quilting classes at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility. The life skills program shut down in the spring of 2020 when the pandemic started. Oregon correctional facilities were especially hard hit by COVID and have been cautious about allowing volunteers back in.

CCQ President Laura Spurrell said some CCQ volunteers aren't able to return to the classroom, as might be expected in a four year hiatus. So the organization is actively recruiting new volunteers. "We need more classroom teachers so we can offer additional classes,"

Laura said. "We also need volunteers to fill other roles such as fabric sorting, kit making, and organizational tasks."

Laura invites all who might be interested in volunteering with Coffee Creek Quilters to an information session on Saturday, March 16th at 9:30 am. It will be held at St. Francis Church's Wisdom House, 8818 SW Miley Rd, Wilsonville.

We are currently teaching two classes per week --Monday mornings and Wednesday evenings. Each student makes three quilts during 12 to 24 months in the program. The first two quilts are donated to a variety of organizations that serve hospital patients, terminally ill adults, and foster children. Students may keep the third quilt they make or give it to a loved one.

We would also like to mention that Coffee Creek Quilters will hold a fabric sale on June 15, 2024, to support the prison quilting program. Details will be posted on our website when plans for the sale are set. We are unable to accept donations of fabric, notions, or sewing machines at this time.

HAWAIIAN APPLIQUÉ CLASS WITH CONNIE JOHNSON SAYLER



NWQ guild is inviting your members to an upcoming needle turn applique class members and non-members for \$55 for 6 hour in person class.

Hawaiian Quilts are visually amazing and look complex but are very easy to make. I learned to make Hawaiian quilts from Nancy Lee Chong in 2008 and have become hopelessly addicted, so much so that I purchased Pacific Rim Quilt Company.

1 Day Workshop:

In this I day class you will gain hands-on experience cutting out a Hawaiian block, basting it and learning

needle turn appliqué. We'll have six different Hawaiian block patterns for you to choose from as your class project. Even though we work on a block in class you will leave knowing what you need to appliqué a large Hawaiian Quilt.

Learn and make a large block using needle-turn applique.

Six designs to choose from.

Supply List:

- Two Contrasting Fabrics: Two 22-24" or larger square pieces (100% cotton) Both fabrics should be solid or nearly solid colors. Choose two colors with strong contrasting values. They may be light and dark of the same color or two different colors. I ALWAYS prewash my fabrics.
- Practice fabrics: Two 12" square pieces of contrasting fabrics. These will be used to practice the needleturn techniques
- Milliners/Straw Needles size 10 or II
- Needle for basting Thread for Appliqué: that matches your appliqué fabric.
- Thread for basting: color not important
- Thread snippers and paper scissors Fabric shears: good enough to cut through 8 layers of fabric.
 8"Gingher shears or equivalent.
- Straight pins
- Pencil or pen: Permanent or temporary (no ballpoint pens)
- Masking tape: Not blue painters tape
- Optional items: reading glasses, thimble, needle threader, portable light

Bring a sack lunch. Coffee is provided in the morning.

Block of the Month

January 2024

This is a scrappy variation of the Log Cabin block. You will need White (or White-on-White) and six (6) different colored fabrics to complete this block.


Cut the White or White-on-white ...

One (1) square ... 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" (piece A)

Two (2) squares ...6 ½ x 6 ½" (piece F) Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on each 6 ½" square. *See directions below to create an 'extra unit.'

Cut the colored rectangles...

Cut one (1) piece B from Color #1... $2 \ \%'' \ x \ 4 \ \%''$ (piece B) Cut one (1) piece C from Color #2... $2 \ \%'' \ x \ 6 \ \%'''$ (piece C) Cut one (1) piece C from Color #3... $2 \ \%'' \ x \ 6 \ \%'''$ (piece C) Cut one (1) piece D from Color #4... $2 \ \%'' \ x \ 8 \ \%''$ (piece D) Cut one (1) piece D from Color #5... $2 \ \%'' \ x \ 8 \ \%''$ (piece D) Cut one (1) piece E from Color #6... $2 \ \%'' \ x \ 10 \ \%''$ (Piece E)



Sew rectangles to A square in alphabetical order to make Log Cabin unit. (A, B, C, C, D, D, E)



Place one (1) white square on the Log Cabin unit, right sides facing. Stitch diagonally from corner to corner. Trim %" beyond stitching. Repeat at opposite corner of Log Cabin unit









*To make an "extra unit" draw a second line on the F scuare that is ½" from the first line. Be sure the second line is closer to the outer corner of the Log Cabin unit when placing this F square on the Log Cabin unit right sides together. Sew on each line. Cut apart between the two drawn/sewing lines. Set the smaller unit aside.
